POWER FOR JOBS (Cont'd)

Non-NYPA Load Supply Service Options: (Cont'd)

1. ESCO Supply Service (ESS):

This Retail Access choice includes fixed components for RG&E delivery service, a Transition Charge (Non-Bypassable Charge ["NBC"] as described in Section 12.B.), and a Bill Issuance Charge. Customers that elect ESS and receive a Consolidated Bill will not be subject to the Bill Issuance Charge. An Energy Service Services Company ("ESCO") provides Electric Power Supply to the customer. RG&E provides the delivery service only.

Transition Charge ("TC", or Non-Bypassable Charge ["NBC"]):

All customers served under this Service Classification, taking service under the ESS option will be required to pay a Transition Charge per kWh, as described in Section 12.B.

Delivery Charges, Monthly Customer Charge, Monthly Minimum Charge, and System Benefits Charge are specified in their respective sections of this Service Classification.

2. RG&E Supply Service (RSS):

This Non-Retail Access choice includes fixed components for RG&E delivery service, a Transition Charge (Non-Bypassable Charge ["NBC"] as described in Section 12.B), a Bill Issuance Charge, and a commodity charge that fluctuates with the market price of electricity and consists of energy, capacity, capacity reserves, losses, unaccounted for energy, ancillary services and a NYPA Transmission Access Charge (NTAC). Delivery service and Electric Power Supply is provided by RG&E.

Transition Charge ("TC", or Non-Bypassable Charge ["NBC"]):

All customers served under this Service Classification, taking service under the RSS option will be required to pay a Transition Charge per kWh, as described in Section 12.B.

Electricity Supply Charge:

The charge for Electric Power Supply provided by RG&E will fluctuate with the market price of electricity and will include the following components: Energy, Energy Losses, Unaccounted for Energy, Capacity, Capacity Reserves, Capacity Losses, ancillary services, NTAC, and a Supply Adjustment Charge.

Delivery Charges, Monthly Customer Charge, Monthly Minimum Charge, and System Benefits Charge are specified in their respective sections of this Service Classification.
