2.15 Explanation of Terms (Cont'd)

TONE DIAL SIGNALING ("TD")

An electronic signal emitted by the circuitry of Touch-Tone-type push-button dials to represent a dialed digit.

TOUCH CALLING

Multifrequency dialing arrangement furnished from central offices whereby calls are originated through the use of push buttons in lieu of a rotary dial.

TRANSMISSION FACILITIES

The facilities used to provide analog or digital voice grade signals to Customers, consisting of cable television facilities available for the Company's use and suitably equipped to provide two way voice communications.

TRUNK

A communication line between two switching systems. The term switching system typically includes equipment in a central office (the telephone Company) and PBXs. A tie trunk connects PBXs. Central office trunks connect a PBX to the switching system at the central office.

TWO WAY

A service attribute that includes DOD for outbound calls and can also be used to carry inbound calls to a central point for processing.

USER

A customer, joint user, or any other person authorized by a customer to use service provided under this Tariff.

VOICE GRADE FACILITY

A communications path between two points comprised of any form or configuration of physical plant capable of and typically used in the telecommunications industry for transmission within the frequency bandwidth of approximately 300 to 3000 Hertz.

WEEKEND

Weekend rates apply for any portion of a call occurring during the period from 11:00 P.M. to but not including 8:00 A.M. Sunday through Friday, all Saturday, and Sunday to but not including 5:00 P.M.
