## SECTION 6-OPTIONAL CALLING PLANS

### 6.2 AT&T REACH OUT<sup>®</sup> NEW YORK (Cont'd)

#### 6.2.2 REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

11. The non-recurring charge will be waived for those AT&T Reach Out State subscribers who change their optional calling plan to any of the AT&T REACH OUT New York plans.
12. AT&T REACH OUT New York is provided only where billing capability exists.
13. The Company reserves the right to change the rates and discounts, as described in Section 2.2.1.3. of this tariff.
14. Message details are included in the Rates.
15. AT&T REACH OUT New York plans may be discontinued by the Customer upon written or telephonic notice to AT&T. In addition, AT&T will discontinue a Customer's subscription to the Plan in the following situations:
  - a. When AT&T is notified, on or after November 25, 1991, that the Customer has changed its primary interexchange carrier to a carrier other than AT&T after the Customer subscribed to the Plan, and the Customer has not notified AT&T that it wishes to continue such Plan. Discontinuance will be effective as of the date the Customer changed its primary interexchange carrier.
  - b. When AT&T has notified a Customer in writing that it plans to discontinue the Customer's Plan and the Customer does not, within 30 days of such notification, notify AT&T that it wishes to continue such Plan. Discontinuance will be effective 30 days from AT&T's mailing of its notification to the Customer.
