SECTION 2-GENERAL REGULATIONS

2.18 EXPLANATION OF TERMS

Access Arrangement

A transmission path between a Customer location and a Point-of-Presence (POP) where access to this Company's switched network is obtained for the purpose of completing calls.

Accessories

The term "Accessories" denotes devices which are mechanically attached to, or used with, the facilities furnished by the Company and which are independent of, and not electrically connected to, the conductors in the communications path of the telecommunications system.

Adjacent City Blocks

City blocks which have a common boundary at any point formed by a street, railroad or small natural barrier such as a small creek (blocks separated by parks, large water barriers such as canals or rivers, or by railroad yards, are non-adjacent).

AT&T Calling Card

A card authorized and issued by AT&T to which the charges for a call may be billed (see also Calling Card).

AT&T Long Distance Service (LDS)

The name under which the direct dialing capabilities of the AT&T Public Switched Network are marketed. The charges for LDS calls are based on (a) the distance between the calling and called telephones, (b) the day of the week, (c) the time of day, (d) the type of call (directly dialed, Customer Dialed or Operator Dialed), and (e) the length of time of the call. Customers may dial their AT&T intrastate LDS calls using the 1, 10+288+1, 10+288+0 or 0 prefix before the called NPA and number, or 00 for the AT&T operator.

Authorized Protective Connecting Module

Denotes a protective unit designed by the Company and manufactured under the control of Company quality assurance procedures, which unit is to be incorporated in a Conforming Answering Device.
