SECTION 2-GENERAL REGULATIONS

2.13 BUSINESS AND RESIDENCE SERVICE (Cont'd)

3. Residence Service does not apply to service in Residential locations if the listing indicates a Business or Profession, except as follows:
 - a. A Professional designation is permitted on Residence Service in the case of a physician, surgeon, dentist, osteopath, chiropodist, podiatrist, optometrist, chiropractor, physiotherapist, Christian Science practitioner, veterinary surgeon or registered nurse or licensed practical nurse, provided that the same name and designation is also listed on Business Service of that Subscriber or another Subscriber in the same or different directory.
 - b. The listing of service in the Residence of a clergyman may include the designation "parsonage", "rectory", "parish house", or "manse", and any such listing may be indented under a listing in the name of the church. Where Residence Service is furnished in a church study, the listing may include the designation "study".
 - c. A designation of fraternity, sorority, convent or monastery is permitted on Residence Service of a college fraternity or sorority house, convent or monastery. Such listing of a college fraternity or sorority house may be indented under a listing in the name of a college and such listing of a convent or monastery may be indented under a listing in the name of a church or school.
 - d. Residence Service also does not apply to service furnished in Residential locations if there is an extension line between the Residential location and a Business location; however, if the extension line is limited to incoming calls only, Residence Service may be applied to the service.
