- 2.7.2 Interference and Hazard The operating characteristics of the access connected to an AT&T service must not interfere with, or impair, any services provided by AT&T to others. In addition, they must not endanger the safety of AT&T employees or the public; damage or interfere with the functioning of AT&T equipment, channels or services; or otherwise injure the public in its use of these offerings.
- 2.7.3 Minimum Protection Criteria Minimum Protection Criteria have been specified so that AT&T personnel, equipment and services will be protected from the harmful effects of hazardous voltages, longitudinal imbalance and signal power overload. Minimum Protection Criteria apply to the direct electric, acoustic or inductive connections of Customer test equipment and other access. Access must comply with the Minimum Protection Criteria as specified in this tariff for the service to which the access is connected.
