G. Three-Way Calling

Three way calling is a feature that allows the Customer to add a third party to an existing conversation without operator assistance. The Customer initiating the Three Way Calling may hold one party with privacy exclusion while initiating and conversing with another Party and can at the Customer's initiation include the held Party in the Three Way Calling. If used with Call Waiting, a third party cannot be added when a call is in progress and a Call Waiting call is connected.

H. This feature is available on monthly usage basis or a pay-per-use basis. On a pay per use basis, this service is capped at 8 calls per month.

I. Speed Call

This feature allows a Customer to establish a connection to certain pre-selected telephone numbers by dialing an access code. This feature is available as Speed Dialing 8, which has a limit of eight speeddialing access codes, and Speed Dialing 30, which has a limit of 30 speed-dialing access codes. The telephone number associated with an access code may not be greater than 15 digits.

J. Anonymous Call Rejection

A Customer can redirect incoming calls for which calling name and number display has been suppressed through the use of Call ID Block or Caller ID Blocking Per Line, to an announcement indicating that the Customer is not presently accepting such calls. The Customer may activate or deactivate this feature without charge by dialing a code.
