> > iii. the Company has good cause for believing that an actual reading obtained is likely to be wrong; provided, however, that estimated bills for this reason may be rendered no more than once without the Company taking corrective action before the rendering of the next cycle bill;

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- iv. circumstances beyond the control of the Company prevented the Company from obtaining an actual reading:
- v. an actual reading was lost or destroyed; provided, however, that an estimated bill for this reason may be rendered no more than once without the Company taking corrective action;
- vi. an estimated reading has been ordered or authorized by the Commission for a particular billing cycle;
- vii. an estimated reading has been approved as the billing method consistent with the Company's tariff for the billing period; or
- viii. an unmetered condition was in existence during the period.
- Every estimated bill must be calculated in accordance with an established formula which takes into account the best available relevant factors for determining the customer's usage.

6.3 No Access Procedure

- The Company must begin providing no access notices as described in (a) paragraphs 6.3 (a) through (g) of this Section with the next cycle bill issued after bills were estimated for a period of 6 consecutive months because of conditions listed in paragraphs 6.2 (a) (i) or 6.2 (a) (ii) of this Section.
- The no access notices and charges described in paragraph 6.3 of this Section (b) must be directed only to the access controller. In any case where the access controller is not the customer of the subject account, a copy of these no access notices must also be sent to the customer at the same time.
