### **Miscellaneous Provisions - Continued**

#### (R) Suspension of Service Fees:

A Marketer may request the Company to suspend service to a residential Customer as defined below who receives Consolidated Bills. By submitting a request for suspension of service to the Comp any in the authorized form, a Marketer represents that it has complied with all statutory requirements for termination and suspension.

The charges set forth below apply to a Marketer who requests suspension of residential service where gas is supplied directly to:

(1) any single-family dwelling or building occupied as the home, residence or sleeping place of one or more persons, or

(2) to any individual flat or apartment in a multiple family dwelling or building or portion thereof occupied as the home, residence or sleeping place of one or more persons.

Suspension Visit to the Premises:	\$29.00	each time the Company sends an employee to the Customer's premises to suspend gas and/or electric service, provided, however, that this charge will be \$37.50 if both gas and electric services are disconnected at the meter during the visit.
Visit to End Suspension:	\$66.00	each time for a residential non-heating Customer if the Company sends an employee to the Customer's premises to end the suspension of gas service, provided, however, this charge will be reduced to \$45.00 if the Company is unable to gain access to the meter.
	\$248.00	each time for a residential heating Customer if the Company sends an employee to the Customer's premises to end the suspension of gas service, provided, however, this charge will be reduced to \$29.00 if the Company is unable to gain access to the meter.
