SERVICE-POINT DISTRIBUTION SERVICE (Cont'd)

SPECIAL PROVISIONS: (Cont'd)

The Distribution Provider will monitor the Distribution Customer's selection of Retail Customer service classification and reserves the right to switch the Retail Customer's service classification if it is determined that the provisions of applicability are not being met.

Service Classification No. 1 Residential Service

1. Applicable to Use of Service For: All purposes, in entire control area, by single family residential Retail Customers in single family dwellings, individual flats or apartments; and also for all electricity utilized exclusively in connection with religious purposes by any corporation or association organized and conducted in good faith for religious purposes; and for all electricity utilized exclusively in a community residence for the mentally disabled as defined in Subdivisions 28, 28-a and 28-b of Section 1.03 of the Mental Hygiene Law, provided, however, that such facilities shall be operated by a not-for-profit corporation, and, if supervisory staff is on site twenty four hours per day, the residence must provide living accommodations for 14 or fewer residents. This classification is available to all such Retail Customers provided one meter for the above service is used.

2. Character of Service:

Residential Customers:

Continuous – Alternating Current, 60 Cycle; 120, 120/208, or 120/240 Volts – Single Phase. (Characteristics depend upon available circuits.)

Religious, Veterans' Organizations, and Community Residence Supportive Living Facility Customers: Continuous – Alternating Current, 60 Cycle; Single or Three Phase. (Characteristics depend upon available equipment.)

- **3. Nonresidential Use:** In buildings intended for residential purposes where not more than two rooms are used for business or for professional purposes, this classification will apply to both uses, provided the total connected load of such nonresidential use does not exceed 2,000 watts.
- **4. Multiple-family Dwellings:** In multiple-family dwellings, with not more than four family units, where each living unit is separately metered and billed under this classification, the incidental electricity used in common by all of the family units, such as hall, cellar or stair lighting, (but excluding water heating, space heating, air conditioning, laundry and other motor driven equipment), may be served under this classification if metered together with the usage of one of the residential units.
- **5. System Benefits Charge:** The rates and charges under this Service Classification are increased by the applicable system benefits charge shown in the System Benefits Charge Statement as mandated by Public Service Commission Order issued January 26, 2001.

6. Net Metered Farm Waste Generator Service

- a. Service under this provision will be offered to Retail Customers who comply with the terms and conditions set forth in Rule 10 of this tariff.
- b. The farm waste generator must be fueled at a minimum of 90% on an annual basis by biogas produced from the anaerobic digestion of agricultural waste such as livestock manure materials, crop residues, and food processing waste, with a least 75% by weight of its feedstock being livestock manure materials on an annual basis.
