#### 6. EXTENSION AND MAINTENANCE OF DISTRIBUTION PROVIDER FACILITIES (Cont'd)

#### **K. UNDERGROUND RESIDENTIAL DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS IN SUBDIVISIONS (Cont'd)**

##### **(1) Pre-conditions**

Prior to construction, the Distribution Customer shall execute the Application for Underground Residential Distribution System (shown under Rule 13) and comply with any applicable provisions of Rule 6.

##### **(2) Installation of Underground Distribution System within Subdivisions**

###### **(a) Contribution by the Distribution Customer**

Before construction is commenced, the Distribution Customer shall make a per-foot contribution based on the distribution line, supply line, and/or service line footage in excess of the required footage allowance specified in Rule 6.B.(1). The Distribution Customer Trenching Credit shall be applied in accordance with Rule 6.K.(6)

	<u>Per foot</u>
Distribution Line Contribution	\$ 8.07
Supply Line Contribution	\$ 8.07
Service Line Contribution	\$ 6.68
Distribution Customer Trenching Credit	\$ 4.49

The forgoing per-foot contributions may be modified by the Distribution Provider by a filing with the Public Service Commission on or before May 1 of each year. Said cost will be based on the experienced average cost of all underground line extensions installed in residential subdivisions for the 12 months ended December 31 of the previous year.

If, after the underground system construction is completed, the development of the subdivision is modified by the addition of dwelling units which then take service from the distribution line within the boundaries of the subdivision, the Distribution Provider will recalculate the contribution and make an appropriate refund, without interest, but in no case will the refund exceed the original contribution. Any portion of the charge remaining unrefunded five years from the date the Distribution Provider is first ready to render service shall be retained by the Distribution Provider.

Any footage allowances provided under Rule 6.B. shall be first applied to the distribution system, including supply lines where supply lines are required to be underground, then to any service lines.
