SERVICE CLASSIFICATION NO. 3 (CONT'D)
(POWER RATE)

POWER FACTOR:

The customer shall maintain a power factor at the point of his delivery of not less than ninety (90) percent lagging or leading as measured on a monthly basis. If customer is notified that their power factor has fallen below ninety (90) percent, corrective action must be taken within ninety (90) days. If action is not taken, the necessary corrective equipment will be installed by the Municipal Commission of Boonville and the customer will be billed for all costs incurred to correct the power factor to the required level.

TERMS OF PAYMENT:

Payment of the rate amount will be accepted on or before the twenty third (23rd) day of the month (or the next business day if the twenty third (23rd) day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or Holiday), provided all outstanding bills are paid; otherwise, there will be a Late Payment of one and one half (1½%) percent assessed monthly to the bill. The postmark on remittances received by mail will be taken as evidence of whether or not consumers are entitled to receive the Rate amount or subject to the Late Payment charge. All partial payments must first be credited against an outstanding bill in the event one exists. Failure to receive a bill will not entitle consumer to the Rate amount.

TERM:

One (1) year from commencement of service under this Service Classification or under a Service Classification superseded hereby, and thereafter until canceled by Customer upon ninety (90) days prior written notice to the Village. Cancellation by Customer followed by resumption of service at the same location within one (1) year shall not modify in any way the DETERMINATION OF BILLING DEMAND as above provided.

When the amount of investment by the Village or other conditions of the service are such as to warrant, the Village may, with the permission of the New York State Public Service Commission, require that the initial term be longer than one (1) year.
