The lighting of streets, highways, roadways, and ways open to public use by vehicles or pedestrians in parks or other public places, for the State of New York, for municipal corporations, for duly constituted street lighting districts, and for duly constituted public agencies, public authorities and public corporations.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE:

Standard lighting service supplied hereunder shall be for dusk-to-dawn illumination, photo-electrically controlled, operated approximately 4,000 hours per year or continuously, approximately 60 cycle and at appropriate voltages or currents designated by Company. Customer may designate the following types of service:

- A. Standard Overhead Service, available only in those areas where an overhead distribution system is maintained by Company. Such service, where available, shall include all facilities required to supply overhead service to lamps utilizing luminaires offered that are mounted on wood poles which are a part of Company's general distribution system.
- B. Standard Underground Service, including utilization of all underground circuit which is supplied by Company without an excess circuit charge as of the effective date of this schedule, or the installation of new underground circuit not in excess of 50 feet per lamp and all other facilities required to supply underground service to lamps utilizing luminaires offered that are mounted on metal or composite poles installed by Company. At the option of Company, customer may furnish and own the poles, foundations, conduits and/or circuit pursuant to Company's specifications.
- C. Standard Underground Residential Distribution Service, including utilization of all underground circuit which is supplied by Company without an excess circuit charge as of the effective date of this schedule, or the installation of new underground circuit not in excess of 10 feet per lamp and all other facilities required to supply service to lamps utilizing luminaires offered that are mounted on metal or
