SPECIAL PROVISIONS:(Continued)

F. Customer's equipment and wiring shall be approved by a competent inspection agency. The Company shall approve the unit installation and may restrict the type of equipment to be installed on existing wood poles. Connection to Company's system shall be made only by Company's personnel or its designees.

G. Company shall have the right to discontinue service to any customer owned equipment which in the opinion of Company shall have become unsatisfactory for further service by reason of deterioration, civil commotion, state of war, explosion, fire, storm, flood, lightning, or any other cause reasonably beyond Company's control.

H. Company will use reasonable diligence to provide a continuous regular and uninterrupted supply of service, and in event of an interruption, Company shall make all reasonable effort to restore service promptly.

I. An audit may be conducted by Company and customer's representatives of customer's traffic signal system when discrepancies in billing quantities are detected. If additional equipment has been installed without notification to Company, Company will bill the customer as though the equipment was installed at the time of the last audit.

J. If line extensions are required, Company will install the required line extension at the expense of the applicant. If other customers are attached to the line extension within a five-year period, Company will refund to the applicant on the basis of Rules 15, 16 and 17 of the General Electric Tariff.

K. In the event of changes or revisions of this service classification, customer shall take and pay for service in accordance with the provisions of the revised or superseding service classification. Charges to customers shall be prorated between the superseding and the superseded rate on the basis of the actual number of days in the billing period, with the superseding charges applying to the days of service taken on or after the effective date of such change.
