### 2. <u>Storage Service Surcharge</u>

The storage service surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. is equal to the weighted average cost of the storage services included in the Company's calculation of the Monthly Gas Cost Adjustment.

# 3. <u>Storage Space Surcharge</u>

The storage space surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. is equal to the weighted average cost of the storage space included in the Company's calculation of the Monthly Gas Cost Adjustment.

#### 4. Capacity Release Surcharge

If a customer or their Retail Supplier chooses to take assignment of the upstream pipeline capacity under contract to the Company the customer will be charged for that service through the Capacity Release Surcharge. The capacity release surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. is equal to the weighted average cost of pipeline capacity included in the Company's calculation of the Monthly Gas Cost Adjustment.

### E. CUSTOMER CHANGES SUPPLIER

- (a) If a Retail Access Program Customer chooses to change Retail Suppliers, the new Retail Supplier of the customer must provide written authorization to the Company of such change at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the effective date of such change;
- (b) Upon receipt of the authorization to change suppliers, the Company will send confirmation to the customer and both Retail Suppliers. The Company will amend its records to reflect the change, and shall be authorized to treat the new Retail Supplier as the customer's Retail Supplier;
