APPLICABLE TO USE FOR:

Suppliers providing commodity and other services to retail Customers receiving distribution services under Service Classification No. 21, Customer Transportation, Balancing and Aggregation ("CTBA"). Service hereunder is available to any party (hereinafter called "Supplier" or "STBA Supplier") which (1) is authorized to provide service to and has enrolled CTBA Customers forming a CTBA Customer Group with an annual aggregate consumption of no less than 5,000 Mcf; (2) meets the requirements for creditworthiness determined by the Company; and (3) has entered into a STBA Service Agreement with the Company.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE:

Gas utility aggregation service billed to Supplier. Subject to the provisions of this Rate Schedule, the tariff and the STBA Agreement, the Company will accept gas deliveries on behalf of Supplier*s CTBA Customers at designated receipt points and shall deliver or cause to be delivered gas supplies sufficient to meet said CTBA Customers* requirements. Company will bill Supplier for aggregation services, including balancing, provided for Supplier. All applicable distribution and related pipeline demand charges are identified in Rate Schedule CTBA and billed directly to the CTBA Customer(s). Aggregation charges set forth herein shall be billed exclusively to Supplier.

RATES AND CHARGES:

Rates and charges for balancing, billing and related services under this Rate Schedule are set forth in the applicable sections below.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

1. Retail Billing Services

a. Two-Bill Method

The default billing method shall be the Two-Bill Method, by which the Company bills the retail Customer for all charges under Rate Schedule CTBA, and Supplier shall issue its own Customer bill for charges not included in the Company*s bill, subject to the Consumer Protection requirements set forth infra.
