16. QUANTITY LIMITATIONS AND CURTAILMENT PROVISIONS: (CONT'D)

- B. Order of Curtailment: (Cont'd)
 - (9) Plant protection requirements for customers curtailed in Categories 4 through 8 above.
 - (10) Industrial and commercial requirements, where combined total base annual requirements are less than 1,200 Dth.
 - (11) Residential requirements.

Provided, however, the above curtailment provisions shall not limit or restrict the Company from curtailing and interrupting daily deliveries as provided for in the Customer's applicable service classifications or other provisions of this Schedule.

C. Customers Purchasing Non-Utility Supplies Other Than Residential and Human-Needs Customers:

As a condition of transportation service, each non-utility supplier must file a curtailment plan with the Company. Curtailment plans must contain enough detail to allow the Company to implement the filed plan.

In the event a long-term curtailment is invoked, the Company shall have the right to terminate service or reduce deliveries to customers in accordance with their curtailment plan.

D. Unauthorized Overrun Penalty:

Customers who, during a designated period of curtailment hereafter take quantities in excess of their base level of usage shall pay a penalty for such excess, in addition to all other rates and charges payable by said customer, of \$25 per Dth. The Company shall establish the base level of usage by averaging the Customer's weather-normalized usage for the previous three (3) years or less for newer customers.

In the event additional supplies are made available, the Company shall have the right, without obligation, to waive any penalty charges incurred under this section.
