Transportation Demand Adjustment (Cont'd)

- (3) Propane Service will be equal to the average cost of propane supplies as shown on Schedule 7-H of the Statement of Gas Cost Adjustment.
- (4) Commencing May 1, 1996, customers shall be charged a surcharge in accordance with the New York State Public Service Commission's Order issued November 30, 1995, in Case 88-G-062 concerning the collection of take or pay costs. The surcharge is designed to collect over a twenty-four (24) month period the remaining uncollected balance of the take or pay costs incurred by the Company. The Take or Pay Surcharge will be shown on the monthly filed Statement of Gas Transportation Rates. The Take or Pay Surcharge will be reconciled for the twelve month period ended December 31 of each year.
- (5) The charges as provided for above shall be increased by the ULIEEP surcharge, as described in General Information, Section 38.

Deliverability Demand Components

Customers taking service under Service Classification No. 12 will be charged the following demand related charges. The customers billing determinants will be provided upon request as defined in General Information, Section 41.

(1) Peaking Service Surcharge

The peaking service surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. will be applied to the Customer's peaking service billing determinant.

(2) Storage Service Surcharge

The storage service surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. will be applied to the Customer's storage service billing determinant.

(3) Storage Space Surcharge

The storage space surcharge rate per 100 cu. ft. will be applied to the Customer's storage space billing determinant.
