CAPACITY BROKERING (Cont'd)

BILLING

1. The upstream pipeline shall bill the Assignee at the agreed upon rate times the maximum daily quantity assigned plus any additional costs or charges associated with the assigned capacity.
2. The Company shall also bill assignee taking service under firm or interruptible Service Classifications the applicable charges as determined under that service classification.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. The Company shall have no obligation to allocate capacity to customers or other parties who are not willing to pay the maximum rate, unless all requests for assignment at the maximum rate have been satisfied. In the event that insufficient capacity is available to meet all the maximum rate bids the available capacity shall be prorated among all parties. In the event that capacity is available after all requests for capacity at the maximum rate have been satisfied, capacity shall be allocated to customers and other parties pursuant to the Company's Capacity Brokering Procedures.
2. The Company may assign capacity on either a firm or recallable basis. Nothing herein shall prohibit Assignee from reassigning the assigned services to a subsequent Assignee, or any subsequent assignments thereafter.
3. Assignees, have the right to permit other parties, as their agent, to administer their contracts for assignment of services. An agent may administer assignment of service contracts for more than one customer and aggregate assignment of service for such customers under all of those contracts. The Assignee must provide the Company notice of whom its agent is at least three (3) days prior to the date the agent will assume responsibility for administering the customer's assignment of service contract. The customer may appoint one agent for each assignment of service contract.
4. All assignees or their agents must be connected to the information and communication system specified by the Company. The Company shall have no obligation to allocate capacity to customers or other parties who are not connected to the information and communication system.
