### GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 18. TRANSITION SURCHARGE (TS): (CONT'D)

The capacity costs to be recovered by the TS are calculated as follows:

The portion of capacity costs (\$cap) associated with customers that have switched from sales to transportation service after April 1, 1999 or who have had capacity assigned but are no longer taking such assignment, should be calculated as follows:

$$\text{\$cap} = (\text{tcap} / \text{ucap}) \times \text{ucap}\$$$

where

tcap = amount of capacity associated with customers using their own capacity to bring gas to the citygate (dt)

ucap = total utility upstream pipeline capacity (dt)

ucap\$ = utility upstream capacity costs (\$)

The prices and charges applicable to the above Service Classifications will be adjusted on April 1, 1999, November 1, 1999 and annually beginning each November 1st thereafter. The Company may restate the TS should the projected variation in costs differ from recoveries by more than fifteen percent (15%).

#### 19. Weather Normalization Adjustment (WNA):

A. Applicability:

- (1) The WNA will be applicable to all customers taking service pursuant to Service Classification Nos. 1, 2, and 9 of PSC No. 87 Gas, or superseding issues thereof, and Service Classification Nos. 1, 5, 13 and 14 of PSC No. 88 Gas, or superseding issues thereof.
- (2) The WNA will be applied to the total gas usage during the WNA season of October 1 through May 31 of each year.
  - (a) If only a portion of customer's total gas usage is applicable to the WNA season, then the total gas usage will be prorated.
