Customers in all areas will also be charged the applicable Transition Surcharge (TS) pursuant to General Information Section 16 of PSC No. 90 Gas, or superseding issues thereof, for all Therm use.

E. Surcharge to Collect Temporary State Assessment:

Customers in all areas will also be charged the Temporary State Assessment per Therm of gas delivered as explained in Section 21 of PSC No. 90 Gas, or superseding issues thereof.

F. System Benefits Charge (SBC):

Customers in all areas will also be charged the System Benefits Charge (SBC) pursuant to General Information Section 20 of PSC No. 90 Gas, or superseding issues thereof, for all Therm use.

G. Energy Efficiency Tracker:

Customers in all areas will also be charged the Energy Efficiency Tracker pursuant to General Information Section 20 of PSC No. 90 Gas, or superseding issues thereof, for all Therm use.

MINIMUM CHARGE (per month):

For all areas, the Minimum Charge is the Basic Service Charge, per meter, plus the Bill Issuance Charge, per bill. Additionally, for a large DG customer, the Minimum Charge will also include the Demand Charge per therm of Maximum Daily Transportation Quantity (MDTQ), excluding the portion included in the Basic Service Charge. The Minimum Charge will appear on the Customer's bill whether or not any gas was used during the billing period.
