4.3.11 Termination Liability* 7 (C)

- A. In the event the service is terminated by the Customer prior to completion of the current term commitment period, the Customer shall be liable for an early termination charge, except as noted below. The amount of the early termination charge will be 25% of the monthly recurring charge(s) (MRC) for the remainder of the term. For example:

$$25\% \times \text{MRC} \times \# \text{ of Lines/Channels/Paths} \times \text{Remainder of Term} = \text{Termination Charge} \quad (M)$$

- B. Early termination charges will apply only to those rate elements under a term commitment. If any rates for the service are increased during the term period, exclusive of any increase due to local, state or federal fees, taxes or surcharges, the Customer may terminate the service without incurring an early termination charge. J

- C. Prior to the end of the term commitment period, the Customer may select one of the following options, to be effective at the end of the term:

1. Renew their term commitment,
2. Commit to a new term period,
3. Arrange for a change of service, or
4. Arrange for termination of the service.

In the event the Customer does not select one of the above options, the Customer will be converted to the shortest-term period available under tariff (i.e., one-year term, etc.) for the same service and will be subject to the applicable term commitment, if any, unless the Customer terminates the service within sixty (60) days of the conversion date.
