**RE: CASE 15-G-0244 – Proceeding on Motion of the Commission to Develop
Implementation Protocols for Complying with Inspection Requirements Pertaining
to Gas Service Lines Inside Buildings**

Dear Secretary Burgess:

In accordance with the New York Public Service Commission's *Order Establishing Statewide Inspection Schedules and Procedural Requirements* ("Order") issued April 20, 2017 in the above-referenced case, The Brooklyn Union Gas Company d/b/a National Grid NY ("National Grid" or "Company") hereby submits the following tariff leaves to become effective on June 12, 2017:

Second Revised Leaf No. 125
Original Leaf No. 125.1
To Schedule for Gas Service, P.S.C. No. 12

The filing is in compliance with the Order. Ordering paragraph 8 directs the Company to file tariff amendments to provide that termination of gas service due to an end-use customer's failure to provide access to allow for leakage surveys and corrosion inspections may occur. Customers that fail to provide access for inspections may be assessed a \$100 penalty. If the customer does not remit this penalty, normal termination procedures in Article 2 of the Public Service Law will apply. If the customer remits this penalty yet still denies access, a fifteen day notice of termination will be provided to the customer.

On May 4, 2017, the Company requested an extension of the effective date from May 15, 2017 to June 12, 2017. This request was to allow for applicable newspaper publication requirements set forth in PSC Law §66(12)(b) and 16 NYCRR §720.8.1. This extension request was granted on May 5, 2017.
