Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. (the "Company") herein submits for electronic filing its Statement of Energy Cost Adjustment, Statement No. ECA-72, to its Schedule for Electric Service, P.S.C. No. 3 – ELECTRICITY. This statement is issued February 26, 2018 to become effective March 1, 2018.

The Energy Cost Adjustment ("ECA") rates for March 2018 consist of a Base ECA, a Variable ECA component and a Demonstration Project Cost Recovery component. The Variable ECA: (a) recovers the charges/credits relating to Transmission Congestion Contracts on a monthly basis, pursuant to the Commission's Order issued January 27, 2006, in Case No. 05-E-1090, and (b) recovers program costs on an as-incurred basis for Riders D, E, and F pursuant to the Commission's Order issued June 18, 2015 in Case Nos. 14-E-0423 and 15-E-0191. The Demonstration Project Cost Recovery component recovers the incremental revenue requirement associated with Demonstration Projects undertaken by the Company pursuant to the Commission's REV Track I Order issued on February 26, 2015 in Case No. 14-M-0101.

The March 2018 ECA statement also reflects changes to the Base ECA for rates effective on and after March 1, 2018.¹ The Base ECA is comprised of costs for lost revenues associated with negotiated contracts under Service Classification No. 23, implementation costs associated with Rider M and Mandatory Day Ahead Hourly Pricing, the costs of any Company-run energy efficiency programs ("EE Tracker Mechanism"), and a reconciliation of Base and Variable ECA costs and recoveries from the previous calendar year.
