Corporate Name Change of St. Lawrence Gas Company, Inc.

Dear Secretary Phillips,

On October 18, 2019, the New York State Public Service Commission (“the Commission”) issued an order in the above-referenced proceedings adopting the Terms of the Joint Proposal for St. Lawrence Gas Company, Inc. and Liberty Utilities Co. Within this Order, the Commission adopted the terms of the Joint Proposal (“JP”) filed in the proceedings were adopted and incorporated them into the order. Pursuant to Public Service Law § 70, the JP approves the acquisition of St. Lawrence Gas Company, Inc. by Liberty Utilities Co.

The purpose of this letter is to advise the Commission of the name change from St. Lawrence Gas Company, Inc. to Liberty Utilities (St. Lawrence Gas) Corp. (“St. Lawrence Gas” or “the Company”) that became effective November 1, 2019. Various materials filed with, and received from, the State of New York Department of State effectuating the name change accompany this letter.

St. Lawrence Gas worked with New York State Department of Public Service Staff (“Staff”) to make changes to bills, signage, vehicles, and uniforms. Staff also reviewed communications the Company utilized as part of its outreach program to inform its customers of the name change. The section of the Company’s outreach plan specific to the acquisition, including copies the personal letter template and the newsletter that were mailed to customers in November 2019 following the New York State Public Service Commission's approval of the sale, accompanies this communication. The name change had and continues to have no impact on the safe, reliable distribution of natural gas to customers at the same price.

If there is anything further required to demonstrate compliance with this requirement, please let me know. Thank you for your continued attention to this matter.
