Amendments to Public Service Law (PSL) §66-j, Chapter 200 and 253, were signed into law on July 31, 2013. Chapter 200 allows non-residential customers and farm customers<sup>1</sup>, that participate in net metering with fuel cell electric generating equipment, to apply excess credits to other accounts for any property owned or leased by such customer the Companies. Chapter 253 allows a farm operation<sup>2</sup> utilizing a residential meter to install photovoltaic electric generating systems with a rated capacity of up to 100 kW and be eligible for net metering.

Publication

The Companies respectfully request the requirements of Section 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law regarding newspaper publication be waived as these changes will not affect the majority of the Companies' customers.
