Public Service Law (PSL) 66-j established limits on the amount of generation that is eligible for net metering and authorized the Commission to increase those limits if it was determined in the public interest to do so. The limits set forth in Section 66-j are applicable to solar photovoltaic (PV), farm waste, micro-hydroelectric, micro-combined heat and power, and fuel cell technologies. Consistent with its determination in Case 12-E-0343, the Commission is raising the limit in §66-j from 1% to 3% of the utility's 2005 peak demand for all utilities.

In compliance with Ordering Clause 1 of the Order, the Companies are submitting changes to its tariffs to allow for the increase in the limit for net metering.

Publication

Requirements of Public Service Law Section 66 (12) (b) as to newspaper publication of the tariff revisions are waived pursuant to the Notice.
