The above Statement of Reliability Support Services Surcharge No. 5 is being filed per Rule No. 50 – Reliability Support Services (RSS) Surcharge of PSC No. 220 Electricity. Specifically, Rule No. 50 provides for recovery from customers of cost incurred by the Company, and approved by the Commission, for third-party services to ensure that local reliability needs are met. This statement provides for recovery of costs incurred under the 2013 Reliability Support Services Agreement (“RSSA”) between National Grid and Dunkirk Power LLC, approved by the Commission in this proceeding. The RSSA between National Grid and Dunkirk Power LLC ended December 31, 2015. The RSSA Surcharge Statement included with this filing reflects the setting of the factor to refund the estimated under recovery for all RSS classes.

Attachment No. 1 displays the estimated current under recovery, as of March 2016.

Attachment No. 2 displays the derivation of the rates to recover the RSSA costs.

Statement of Reliability Support Services No. 5 is effective for a 1 month period, April 1, 2016 through April 30, 2016.
