Purpose of the Filing

The Companies are filing tariff amendments in compliance with Ordering Clause No. 5 of the Order to implement an offset tariff provision, as discussed in the Order.

Overview

The Order, directed NYSEG and RG&E to file tariff revisions to its Standby Service Classifications to implement an offset tariff and reliability credit provisions. The Companies implemented standby reliability credit provisions as part of the Companies' rate case compliance filing in Case 15-E-0283 and Case 15-E-0285, submitted on June 29, 2016.

The Standby Offset Provision will allow customers taking standby service from the Companies that have eligible combined heat and power on-site generators with nameplate ratings of two megawatts to twenty megawatts to supply their other accounts that are located at the same premise with generation not consumed by the account with the generator. All participating accounts identified by the customer must be billed on standby rates and have interval metering.

Newspaper Publication

In accordance with Ordering Clause 9 of the Order, the requirements of 66(12) (b) of the Public Service Law requiring newspaper publication has been waived.
