Dear Secretary Phillips:

In compliance with the Public Service Commission's <u>Order Authorizing Phase 2 Arrears Reduction Program</u> in the above referenced proceedings, issued and effective January 19, 2023 (the "Order"), New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation ("RG&E"), (together the "Companies"), hereby file revised statements for the Arrears Relief Program ("ARP") to become effective October 1, 2023.

After the August 1,2023 filing, the Companies realized the filing on August 1, 2023 inadvertently included an estimate of the amount of arrears credited to the customers and not the actual amount of arrears credited to customers. The largest difference at both Companies is the split between electric and gas.
