Re: Case 15-E-0302 – Proceeding on Motion of the Commission to Implement a Large-Scale Renewable Program and a Clean Energy Standard

Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the "Company") hereby submits for filing with the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") the Statement of Clean Energy Standard Delivery Surcharge ("CESD Statement"), to its Schedule for Electric Service – P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the "Electric Tariff").

CESD - Statement No. 2 to P.S.C. No. 10 - Electricity

The CESD Statement is issued on September 15, 2023, to become effective October 1, 2023.

Reason for Filing

The Commission, in its Order Approving Financial Backstop Collection Mechanism, issued and effective June 23, 2023 in the above-referenced proceeding (the "Collection Order"), directed each utility to commence Clean Energy Standard backstop collections of its allocated portion of the cumulative Zero-Emissions Credits deficit of \$33,295,204 (the "Backstop Charges") invoiced by the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority ("NYSERDA") consistent with each utility's existing tariff.

Statement Changes

Pursuant to General Rule 26.5, "Clean Energy Standard Delivery Surcharge" ("CESD Surcharge") of the Electric Tariff, the Company's mechanism for recovery of Backstop Charges

is through the CESD Surcharge.¹ Per the Electric Tariff, the recovery of costs associated with Backstop Charges will be set for a period of one to twelve months depending on the size of the costs. As per the Collection Order, the Company's total allocated Backstop Charges from NYSERDA equals \$12,860,119. The Company will recover these Backstop Charges over a 12-month period. Accordingly, the Company has determined that the CESD Surcharge shall be set at 0.0272 cents per kWh for the 12-month period commencing October 1, 2023. The surcharge rate is reflected on the Statement of Clean Energy Standard Delivery Surcharge that will become effective October 1, 2023.
