Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. (the "Company") is filing with the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") an amendment to its Schedule for Electric Service, P.S.C. No. 3 – ELECTRICITY (the "Electric Tariff"). The revised Electric Tariff Leaf, which is identified below, is filed to become effective on June 1, 2022.

This filing is made pursuant to the Commission's Order Expanding NY-Sun Program, issued and effective April 14, 2022, in the above-referenced cases (the "Order"). The Order directed each utility to file tariff amendments related to the Environmental Component of the Value Stack credit.

Tariff Changes

Pursuant to the Order, the Company has modified the Billing – Value Stack Tariff Section of Rider N – Net Metering and Value Stack Tariff for Customer Generators to remove a

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specific calculation methodology for the Environmental Component Rate¹ of the Value Stack for those customers who receive it. The Electric Tariff continues to state that the Environmental Component Rate can be found on the Value Stack Credits Statement.²

Conclusion and Notice

As directed by Ordering Clause 4 of the Order, the tariff amendment is filed on not less than fifteen days' notice to become effective on June 1, 2022. As specified in Ordering Clause 5 of the Order, the Commission has waived the requirements for newspaper publication.

¹ The Electric Tariff currently states that the Environmental Component Rate is equal to the higher of the clearing price of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority's most recent Tier 1 REC procurement or the Social Cost of Carbon, net of the expected Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative allowance values, as calculated by Department of Public Service Staff.

² As per the Order, the Environmental Component Rate will continue to be equal to its current value of 3.103 cents per kWh.
