Housekeeping Changes

While the currently effective Program does reference the future existence of an Independent System Operator or Power Exchange, the Company's Retail Access Program was established prior to the existence of the New York Independent System Operator ("NYISO"). The Company proposes to make these housekeeping changes to incorporate references to the NYISO and its established procedures, particularly with respect to load balancing. Specifically, the changes proposed by the Company recognize the shift in responsibility for load balancing, both in providing adequate energy supplies and the associated billing, from Central Hudson to the NYISO. As a result, the above referenced amendments do not change the scope of the Company's Program, but more accurately reflect the operation of the Program since the inception of the NYISO.
