Overview

This modification is made solely to ensure all New York Power Authority's ("NYPA") programs for which NYSEG provides delivery service are identified, including the new program referred to as the Preservation Power Program.

Background

Omnibus power legislation, Chapter 313 of the Laws of 2005, enacted in 2005 created a new program called Preservation Power. This law governs the 490 MW allocation of firm and interruptible St. Lawrence-FDR Power Project power sold to Alcoa and GM. The law authorizes allocation of power to businesses in Jefferson, St Lawrence, and Franklin counties. A portion of Franklin County is within NYSEG's service area. As indicated above, this tariff change will include Preservation Power as one of the listed NYPA programs offered to NYSEG customers.

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The Company identified certain provisions within its tariff that did not have a complete list of the NYPA programs under those provisions. These proposed revisions are to provide clarification that all NYPA programs that are offered to NYSEG customers are included when referring to NYPA programs under these provisions.

Newspaper Publication and SAPA

The Company requests that the requirement of Section 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR Section 720-8.1 as to newspaper publication be waived because these tariff changes have no impact on the majority of NYSEG's customers and communications with customers to whom these changes are applicable will take place directly with those customers.

A State Administrative Procedure Act Notice is enclosed for publication in the State Register.
