The enclosed Statements, which are listed below, are issued by Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation to become effective on October 11, 2007, the billing date for the eighth batch of the Company's October 2007 billing cycle, and are transmitted for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Public Service Commission of the State of New York regarding changes in adjustments.

Statement of Market Price Charge and Market Price Adjustment	MPC - 76
Statement of Miscellaneous Charges	MISC - 76
Statement of Purchased Power Adjustment	PPA - 75

The factors included in MPC Statement No. 76 are applicable to energy supplied by the Company and are based on the actual commodity costs required to serve the Company's full service customers during the month of September. MPC Statement No. 76 includes Market Price Adjustment (MPA) factors corresponding to the reconciliation of energy costs for the month of June 2007 which were collected through the MPC and for which collections were completed in September. The UCAP charge billed to customers taking service under the Company's Hourly Pricing Provision (HPP) includes an adjustment to reallocate a component for NTAC and ancillary service charges from July 2007 costs inadvertently not allocated to the HPP UCAP charge originally filed on MPC Statement No. 73 effective August 10, 2007. The \$245,770 reallocation has no impact on MPC factors being filed herein, it will be credited to MPC group customers through the MPA reconciliation to be completed after all July costs have been collected at the end of October 2007.

The factors included in MISC Statement No. 76 are applicable to all energy delivered by the Company and are intended to refund to or collect from customers the net benefit or cost of non-avoidable, variable energy related revenues and costs associated with the Company's remaining generation facilities and from mandatory purchases from Independent Power Producers for the month of September. MISC-76 also includes a reconciliation component for June 2007 costs/benefits.

The factors included in PPA Statement No. 75 are applicable to all energy delivered by the Company and are intended to refund to or collect from customers the benefit or cost, respectively, of the Company's Purchase Power Agreement with the new owners of the nuclear generating plant previously owned by the Company. PPA-75 also includes a reconciliation component for June 2007 costs/benefits.
