These Transition Charges will apply to all customers except those taking service under Service Classification No. 11, Standby Service. For customers taking Standby Service, in accordance with the August 2007

Order, the transition charges are allocated to the Customer Charge, Contract Demand, and As-Used Demand components<sup>1</sup>.
