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Overview of the Filing

In compliance with ordering clause 1 of the Order, the Companies are submitting changes to its tariffs as described herein. The Order requires revisions to certain eligibility requirements that were submitted in the Companies' August 22, 2011 tariff filings. More specifically, the Order requires the Companies to allow an account with a budget payment plan to participate in Remote Net metering as Host or Satellite Account. The Order also directed NYSEG and RG&E to allow the application of excess credits against all of the electric charges, including arrears. The Companies have removed these exclusions from its tariffs.

NYSEG and RG&E are also including a revised Standardized Interconnection Requirements (SIR) Addendum in compliance with ordering clause 4 of the Order.

Publication

In compliance with ordering clause 5 of the Order, newspaper publication is waived because existing non-residential and farm customers affected by these tariff changes will be notified directly. New customers will be advised of these tariff changes when they enter into interconnection agreements with the Company.
