Effective: December 12, 2011

On June 1, 2011, Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2011, amended Public Service Law (PSL) §66-j and §66-l in regards to the remote net metering of farm and non-residential solar photovoltaic or farm waste, and farm and non-residential wind electric customer generators. To implement this law, the major utilities were directed to file tariff amendments conforming their tariffs to these new statutory requirements by August 22, 2001 to become effective December 1, 2011.

Per further review by Staff of the PSC, further clarifying revisions were requested for this filing to which the Company agreed.

Short notice is respectfully requested for these leaves to become on less than statutory time to become effective December 1, 2011 to be consistent with the leaves presently before the Commission in this case number.

Also, waiver of the requirements of 16 NYCRR §720-8 of the Commission’s regulations as to newspaper publication is requested for this filing. Customer-Generators will be informed of these changes by the Company when they apply for remote net metering.
