Tariff Filings to Effectuate Amendments to Public Service Law §66-j and §66-l (Remote Net Metering by Farm and Non-Residential Customer-Generators) and Conforming Changes to Standardized Interconnection Requirements

Effective: December 1, 2011

On June 1, 2011, Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2011, amended Public Service Law (PSL) §66-j and §66-l in regards to the remote net metering of farm and non-residential solar photovoltaic or farm waste, and farm and non-residential wind electric customer generators. To implement this law, the major utilities were directed to file tariff amendments conforming their tariffs to these new statutory requirements. These tariffs were to be filed by July 22, 2011 and the proposed tariff amendments were to have an effective date of October 29, 2011. Since the original notice, the utilities suggested that they required additional time to better understand the requirements of the amendments and to evaluate the impacts of these new requirements. The deadline for submitting these revised tariffs was extended for an additional time to be submitted to the Commission on August 22, 2011 and bear an effective date of December 1, 2011.

The above leaves comply with this directive and proposes revisions to Rule No. 36-Net Metering for Solar Electric Generating Equipment, Farm Waste Electric Generating Equipment, Micro-Combined Heat and Power Generating Equipment and Fuel Cell Generating Equipment and Rule No. 37 – Net Metering for Residential, Farm Service and Non-Residential Wind Electric Generating System to incorporate these changes. Specifically Rule No. 36.7 and Rule No. 37.10 have been added to include Remote Net Metering incorporating the revisions to the law.

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Waiver of the requirements of 16 NYCRR §720-8 of the Commission's regulations as to newspaper publication is requested for this filing. Customer-Generators will be informed of these changes by the Company when they apply for remote net metering.
