#### General

This tariff contains the regulations and rates applicable to Access Services and Network Interconnection Services.

## **Tariff Structure**

This tariff is structured in a manner which separates regulations from rates. The regulations applicable to the services offered in this tariff are placed in sections in the forward part of the tariff; while the rates for those offerings are placed in a single Addendum Price List section in the rear of the tariff. References are provided in the service sections of the tariff to assist the tariff user in the location of rates. Similarly, the rate section contains a list of services with applicable rate section numbers.

To locate the section for a particular service, refer to the Table of Contents, Leaf 2.

## Abbreviations and Definitions

In the front of this tariff is a list of the abbreviations used in the tariff (see Explanation of Abbreviations, leaf 5 of this section). ## **Tariff Format**

#### A. Leaf Numbering

Leaf numbers appear in the upper-right corner of the leaf. Leafs are numbered sequentially within each section. When a new leaf is added between existing leafs with whole numbers, a decimal is added. For example, a new leaf added in Section 2 between leafs 2-6 and 2-7 would be 2-6.1.

#### B. Leaf Revision Numbers

Revision numbers also appear in the upper-right corner of the leaf. These numbers are used to determine the most current leaf version, for example, the 4th revised leaf 3-4 cancels the 3rd revised leaf 3-4. Because of deferrals, notice periods, etc., the most current leaf revision number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff leaf in effect. Consult supplements for the leaf currently in effect.

## 1.4 <u>APPLICATION OF TARRIF</u>

#### 1.4.1 General

This tariff contains regulations, rates and charges applicable to the provision of intrastate Access Services and Network Interconnection Services provided to Customers by AT&T Communications of New York Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Company.

In the event that the Company and the Customer have entered into an Interconnection Agreement, to the extent that the terms of this tariff are inconsistent with the terms of such Interconnection Agreement, the terms of such Interconnection Agreement shall govern (except as otherwise provided in such Interconnection Agreement).

The provision of such services by the Company as set forth in this tariff does not constitute a joint undertaking with the Customer for the furnishing of any service.

The locations served by the Company and the services available are as set forth in Section 16.3.

Effective July 31, 2001 all references herein to AT&T FCC Tariffs, insofar as the service offering set forth in the AT&T FCC tariffs have been or become detariffed, shall be construed to be references to the AT&T Business Services Guides located at <a href="http://www.att.com/serviceguide/business">http://www.att.com/serviceguide/business</a>.

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## 1.5 FLEXIBLE PRICING

## 1.5.1 General

This tariff provides flexible pricing which sets minimum and maximum rates that can be charged for telephone service. Rates may be reduced selectively and in varying amounts, so long as rates cover their relevant incremental costs.

#### 1.5.2 Conditions

- 1. The Company reserves the right to change rates at any time on one day's notice by filing revised Rate Schedule Attachments with the Commission.
- 2. A change affecting the maximum level will be made in accordance with the applicable New York State Public Service Commission Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Appropriate notification of changes in the rates for AT&T Local Exchange Service will be made to the Co-Carrier.
- 4. A rate shall not be changed unless it has been in effect for at least thirty (30) days.
- 5. A Co-Carrier may request that the Company disconnect service that is provided under the flexible pricing due to a rate increase. The Co-Carrier will be credited for the difference between the new rate and the old rate retroactive to the effective date of the increase if the Co-Carrier notifies the Company of its desire to disconnect service within 20 days of receiving notification of the rate increase.
